#### ESF student shines a light as journalist




Xaviera and Mr Andrew Work, Publisher of Harbour Times

## **ESF Kowloon Learning Campus Special Olympics 2016**






The 2016 Kowloon Learning Campus Special Olympics was held with great success earlier this month where students demonstrated a passion for sport.

#### Sha Tin College teacher publishes new IB Chinese textbook



Vivienne Fung, Teacher of Chinese at Sha Tin College, has written two IB textbooks for Language B Mandarin SL and HL (titled "Follow Me Through BSL" and "Follow Me Through BHL". Her textbooks were published last month and are now available in bookstores.

The books provide guidance for students in terms of idea-forming, sentence structure, key vocabulary, references for oral expression, exam banks and model writing tests. It is also the very first IB text to be published by Sinolingua — one of the biggest publishers for teaching Chinese as a foreign language in China.

# Sha Tin College presents at the bi-annual HK Association of Deputy Principals' Conference

The Hong Kong Association of Deputy Principals (HKADP) hosted its bi-annual conference at Chinese University Hong Kong (CUHK) on Tuesday, 24 May. This fund hopes to redeem that loss and help keep Nicola Myers' and Kenneth McBride's ideals and compassion for others alive in support of needy and exceptional local students.

This year, over 180 applications have been received and priority goes to those who are suffering through family misfortune. Approximately HK\$250,000 worth of sponsorships have been be awarded to 101 Form 6 students from local schools, each with a fixed sum of HK\$2,500, enabling them to continue with their education. 


The ESF Dragon Boat Team came 4th in the Stanley race at the Hong Kong Dragon Boat Carnival. Congratulations!
