ESF welcomes new teachers and Board members



New ESF teachers participated in ESF's amazing-race-style "Treasure Hunt" that enabled them to familiarise with public transport and explore popular sightseeing locations.

The new term got off to a great start by us welcoming 103 new teachers to the team. There was further change across ESF with 69 of our teachers moving into new or promoted roles within the organisation. Of the new teachers, 39 teachers were already living here in Hong Kong and 64 teachers came from a wide range of countries including the UK, UAE, New Zealand, China, Australia and Canada.

Following an election we welcome two new parent members to the ESF Board of Governors. Dr Dannis Au will become the parent member, taking up the role in November when the position for a Category 1 parent member, which is a parent of a child in an ESF primary or secondary school becomes vacant. Mrs Dayna Lim Cheung takes up the position of the parent member in Category 2 which is a parent of a child supported through SEN provision from immediate effect.

Launch of ESF Strategic Plan 2015-2020

ESF is moving into a new era. To prepare for this, ESF has engaged in an extensive strategic planning process involving members from the advisory committees and the ESF Board. After a year's work, the refreshed ESF vision and mission along with the ESF Strategic Plan for 2015-2020 have now been approved by the Board and is ready for launch.

Our strategic intent is to be a key driver of best practice in teaching and learning. This is achieved through delivery of four strategic goals under the four pillars – Education, Organisation, Communications and Financial Sustainability. Through creating joyful learning environments and having exceptional teachers, we aim to inspire creativity and nurture the global citizens and leaders of the future.

Water tested at ESF schools

As you may know, over the last few months fresh water sources across Hong Kong have been found to contain significantly high levels of lead.

Over the summer, we took samples from fresh water sources in our schools. From over 300 fresh water sources tested, only 4 samples were found to have levels slightly above the HK Government guidelines. KGV, Sha Tin College, South Island School and West Island School each had one sample with levels slightly above the guidelines. All other fresh water sources in these schools were within the guidelines.

The health and safety of our children, and our staff, is always our number one priority. In this regard, we have taken immediate steps to shut down the four sources whilst action is being taken to ensure levels are within safety standards.

187 graduates awarded ESF Chairman's Awards for Excellence 2015



The ESF Chairman's Awards for Excellence 2015 was held on Wednesday, 26 August at Sha Tin College to recognise the outstanding performance of 187 ESF graduates. More than 450 students, parents and teachers attended the award ceremony to celebrate the students' outstanding achievements.

Abraham Shek, Chairman of ESF, praised the students for their achievements in both academic and non-academic aspects. "ESF has a tradition of excellence in academics, sport and cultural activities. Students leave ESF as confident, well-educated and internationally-minded individuals who are equipped to play constructive roles in our global society," he said.

The award-winning graduates included those with outstanding achievement in Leadership, Commitment and Contribution to Service, Embodying the Spirit and Values of the school, Sporting Achievement and Creativity; as well as in the international Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma the Applied Learning Programme.

Three students have received the inaugural Carlson Tong Award, recognising their outstanding achievement in the bilingual diploma. They have achieved the maximum 7 points for two languages, both of which studied as first language.

ESF schools continue to achieve outstanding results in external examinations. Over the summer, we celebrated excellent IB Diploma, Applied Learning and GCSE/IGCSE results. The results for the IB Middle Years Programme will be announced later.

IB Diploma

934 Year 13 students completed the IB Diploma in May. 98% of students achieved the full IB Diploma, with 61.5% achieving 35 or more IB points and 24.9% achieving 40 or more points. The average points score for students is 35.6 total points and the average grade per subject is 5.6 points.

We are extremely proud of all our students, knowing that they have all worked hard to achieve their best. 17 ESF students achieved the maximum 45 points – setting a new ESF record. There are only 160 students worldwide who

have achieved this in 2015. They include:

Applied Learning Pathway

94 Year 13 students from KGV, IS, SIS and WIS successfully completed the Applied Learning Pathway. These students followed personalised pathways that involved the Business and Technology Education Council award (BTEC), or BTEC with a combination of either IB subject courses and/or AS-levels. BTEC subjects studied include Art and Design; Business; Media; Engineering; Performing Arts; Travel and Tourism and Sport.

For the BTEC Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma, 52% of entries were awarded a *distinction* or above and 74% *merit* or *above*. For the BTEC Level 3 Diploma, 60% of entries were awarded a *double distinction* or above and 81% *double merit* or *above*. For the BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma, 55% of entries were awarded a *triple distinction* or above and 90% *triple merit* or *above*.


GCSE/IGCSE exams

Approximately 1,000 Year 11 students from King George V School, Island School, Sha Tin College, South Island School and West Island School participated in the General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) and its international equivalent the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE). 55% of all examinations were awarded either A* or A grades and 92% awarded A* - C grades. This is the seventh consecutive year that more than 50% of examinations were awarded A* or A grades.

Congratulations to all our students and their teachers on an outstanding set of results in this year's external examinations. We wish all our graduating students well in the future.

To continually enhance learning and teaching approaches in ESF schools, many of our teachers attend international conferences. At the IB Americas Annual Conference held in Chicago this July, Jennifer Wathall, Head of Mathematics at Island School, proudly presented ideas of her soon-to-be published book — "Concept-Based Mathematics: Teaching for Deep Understanding".

Speaking at the conference, Jennifer outlined what she believes to be better ways of learning mathematics, through concept-based curriculum and instruction. "Mathematics is inherently a conceptual language of relationships which lends itself to investigating principles and generalisations," she explained.

Let's make our schools greener

A number of ESF schools have been applying for School Green subsidies from the Hong Kong Leisure and Cultural Services Department to make our school environments greener. The amount of subsidies range from HK\$2,000 to HK\$400,000 for schools to purchase plants, organise gardening activities or install environmental friendly lightings or other facilities.





Sha Tin College uses the subsidy to help with some of the greening projects and also for the Lunchtime 'Green Fingers' activity.

The Bradbury School Eco Dudes received HK\$11,000 for purchasing more fruit trees to help with propagating VOC plants for the classrooms, planting herbs and shrubs and for purchasing a rotating composting bin.

Central applications for Year 1, Year 7 and K1

If you have friends who are interested in applying for ESF schools, please let them know that the applications for admission in August 2016 are now being received for Year 1 (children born in 2011) and Year 7 (children born in 2005) till 30 September.

The central application period for K1 entry in August 2016 to ESF International Kindergartens, including the new Tung Chung campus, will begin on 1 October 2015 and will run until 31 October 2015.


ESF Alumni News is coming soon
